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# **NARRATIVE**

### **Narrative**

The City of Fitchburg is a community of 41,000 people located in north-central Worcester County. Despite being the second largest city in the county, Fitchburg retains its small town flavor. Fitchburg is noted for its old mills that line the Nashua River, its hilly topography and regional parks and its tightly knit neighborhood enclaves that, in many cases, still retain their ethnic identity. Among the city's cultural assets are the Fitchburg Art Museum, Fitchburg State College and the world famous annual Longsjo Classic Bicycle race.

Fitchburg is located just 10 miles from New Hampshire and 50 miles from Boston, with excellent access via highway or MBTA commuter train to all points. The former reliance on the paper industry in the community has given way to a healthier economic diversification which now includes pharmaceuticals, tool and die makers, machine manufacturers, plastic molders and textile producers.

# **TRANSPORTATION**

## TRANSPORTATION AND ACCESS

The principal highway is State Route 2, the old Mohawk Trail, which runs across northern Massachusetts. State Route 140 and Interstate 190 connect the region to Worcester. The Springfield Terminal Railway line (the former Boston and Maine Railroad) parallels Route 2 and provides access to the network of intermodal facilities serving central and eastern Massachusetts.

### **Major Highways**

The principal highway is cross-state Route 2.

#### Rail

Commuter rail service is available to North Station, Boston (travel time 85-94 min.; no MBTA parking). Conrail and the Springfield Terminal Railway (STRR) offer freight service to Fitchburg. Contact number for Conrail: 617) 783-6222; for the STRR: (978 663-1073

#### Bus

Fitchburg is a member of the Montachusett Regional Transit Authority (MRTA), which provides fixed route service within Fitchburg and to Leominster, Gardner, and Fort Devens. The MRTA also offers paratransit services to the elderly and disabled. Peter Pan Bus Lines provides limited service between Fitchburg and Worcester, with direct connection to Hartford, Connecticut, and New York City.

#### Other

The Fitchburg Municipal Airport is a General Aviation (GA) facility located 3 mi SE of the city. It has 2 asphalt runways 4,511'x 100' and 3,502'x 150'. Instrument approaches available: Non-precision.
